**What do we know about frequency of pollination systems in cerrados and forests?**

When researchers began to study pollination in cerrado and forests, they obviously were interested primarily in conspicuous flowers visited by large or rare pollinators. Conversely, generalist and wind-pollinated flowers, as well as flowers pollinated by flies, thrips or non-hovering moths were and are still less studied. Examples will demonstrate this biased situation for cerrados and forests.
